AHEPA - PURPOSE GOALS & IDEALS

AHEPA works hard to promote our values and wishes to recognize young people who share them. You are not expected to have experience in all these areas, so concentrate on those few that are most central to your life and outlook.

- **Hellenism.**
 - a) working for the perpetuation of the Greek and Hellenic culture in all areas, including language, music, literature, art, dance;
 - b) promoting Hellenic studies and other educational programs and initiatives which teach Hellenic topics in colleges and universities.
 - c) honoring the Hellenic legacy: *Search for Truth, Supremacy of Reason, Encouragement of the Free Mind, Pursuit of Excellence, Appreciation of Beauty, Love of Life, Passion for Freedom, Respect for the Individual.*
- **Education.**
 - a) providing scholarships, loans and other financial resources and support for our members and children to pursue greater education;
 - b) providing greater formal and informal educational opportunities for our members;
 - c) educating non-AHEPA Family members and the general public regarding the AHEPA Family, Hellenism, and the goals and mission of the AHEPA Family.
- **Philanthropy.**
 - a) pursuing a wide range of charitable activities related to the AHEPA Family's core mission in the areas of: (i) Hellenism; (ii) education; (iii) other philanthropic causes; (iv) civic responsibility; and (v) family and individual excellence; b) identifying and supporting proper Chapter, Regional and National philanthropic causes which require support and
 - c) supporting the philanthropic, humanitarian and Hellenic cultural programs of the Greek Orthodox Church.
- **Civic Responsibility.**
 - a) actively participating in the governmental processes at the local, state and national levels;
 - b) voting and encouraging an active role in the electoral and legislative process; and
 - c) promoting and facilitating all facets of community service.
- **Family.**
 - a) creating an environment which fosters positive family values and family interaction;
 - b) undertaking initiatives which strengthen the families of our members; and
 - c) educating our youth in the fundamental skills necessary to create and maintain a positive family environment.
- **Individual Excellence.**
 - a) stressing good moral character and ethics;
 - b) fostering athletic activities which emphasize individual excellence, achievement, hard work, sportsmanship and team work; and
 - c) developing and implementing programs which facilitate education and improvement in all facets of one's life.

GUIDE FOR COMPLETING A SUCCESSFUL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION:

Step One:

- A. Applicant should carefully read over the scholarship form before filling it out.
- B. Review the available scholarships and decide which ones you want to concentrate on.
- C. Applications can be hand written (we score for legibility), **or computer generated. The MS WORD application can be sent to you on request, to enable "fill-in". Electronic submittal (cd) or by email along with hard copy is appreciated and welcomed.**
- D. The **Dean Zutes Memorial Scholarships**: Awards are based primarily on need. FAFSA report is required.
- E. **Under Section IV** of the application, if your application is based on financial need, please include additional information related to need. The space provided is limited, however, you may include on separate sheet, pertinent information that will help the committee to evaluate your application.

Step Two:

The rest of the information below applies to all the scholarships submitted.

Essay: Take a little more time in completing the essay. Many applicants in the past lost credits by not following the instructions per Section II of the application e.g. provide a one sheet essay only with the required spacing, a two sheet essay will be scored zero out of 10 points. Stick to the chosen topic and make your point. Hint: The essay should focus on the elements in the attached Goals of the Order of AHEPA. Don't forget to spell check your essay.

Citizenship/Community involvement and extracurricular activities: Understand the difference between these two requirements and *don't forget to include the hours involved* with each as it applies; State total hours for the activity, or hours per week, or month, or year, etc. Include dates where applicable e.g. junior year, senior year, summer activity, etc. Remember, the committee takes notice of vague entries.

a. Citizenship and Community involvement: Is defined to include, ***volunteer work that is unsupervised by the school.*** It is what you choose to do on your own. Some examples are: Helping the Salvation Army as a bell ringer during Xmas Holiday season, fulfilling requirements for Eagle scout, volunteering at a senior center, helping out in your church or some charity organization by fixing, cleaning etc. Hint: Include planning, organizing, executing the activity. Backup documentation can help.

NOTE: **Do not include compensated activities (either monetary, or in exchange for privileges).**

b. Extracurricular Activities: Is defined to include ***school sponsored / supervised activities.*** e.g. Being on a sports team, marching band, school orchestra, school paper, musicals, chorus, etc.

NOTE: Do not include compensated activities (either monetary, or in exchange for privileges).

Backup documentation can help.

3. Hellenic Study: Attending Greek Language School, learning Greek dances, reading books on Greek culture, taking college courses that include elements of Hellenism and Greek philosophy. In simple terms anything that you can relate to furthering your understanding of Hellenism. HS applicants may list all Hellenic Studies exposure including current year. Applicants already in college must limit entries to current Hellenic Studies. Include dates where applicable e.g. junior year, senior year, summer activity, etc. Remember, the committee takes notice of vague entries.

One final reminder: The effort you invest in preparation will be noticed, and the information you assemble for the AHEPA scholarships can be also used in other scholarships which may be available to you.
